Older adults and people with disabilities who are enrolled in the Illinois Department on Aging's Benefit Access program are eligible to ride free on the CTA, Metra, and Pace fixed-route services- All individuals 65 years old and over who are ineligible for the RTA Ride Free Program are eligible to receive a reduced fare permit- All persons with a qualifying disability who are ineligible for the RTA Ride Free Program are eligible to receive a reduced fare permit- Individuals with a valid Medicare card are eligible for a reduced fare permit- Free or reduced fare rides are available for qualifying military personnel in the RTA's service region of Cook, DuPage, Kane, Lake, McHenry and Will counties.
